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Introduction

Vocational Education and Training in Schools (VETiS) is delivery of nationally recognised qualifications to secondary school students, providing them with the skills and knowledge required for employment in specific industries.

The Department of Employment, Small Business and Training (DESBT) provides funding for secondary school students to complete one (1) approved VETiS qualification while at school.

It is very important students, and their parents take the time to consider and compare their training options before signing an enrolment form or committing to a course of study which will use up the student's one (1) Queensland Government subsidised VETiS training entitlement.

Students who complete a VETiS qualification at school are still eligible to access further Queensland Government subsidised training post-school. Further information is available on the department's website at <https://desbt.qld.gov.au/training/training-careers/incentives/vetis>

Qualification Details

The Blue Dog Training VETiS program offers students a choice from the three (3) following qualifications:

- CPC10120 Certificate I in Construction (Refer to Appendix 1)

OR

- CPC20220 Certificate II in Construction Pathways (Refer to Appendix 2)

OR

- MEM20422 Certificate II in Engineering Pathways (Refer to Appendix 3)

Please take the time to read the information in this document and the Blue Dog Training Student Handbook as it is important to select a course, which is right for you.

Course Details

The Blue Dog Training VETiS program is a partnership between the student's school and Blue Dog Training for the delivery of a specific qualification. Queensland secondary students are enrolled as a student with Blue Dog Training and their qualification or statement of attainment is issued by Blue Dog Training.

Training and assessment are completed via Blue Dog Training's blended mode of delivery which comprises of both online training and face-to-face classroom-based training at the school's manual arts workshops. Blue Dog Training trainers and assessors attend schools on a structured basis throughout the school year.

Course Duration

Typically commencing in Year 10 or 11 and delivered in the school manual arts workshops, during school hours as a part of the student's regular school timetable, the course is completed over a period of two (2) years.

Resources

Under the Blue Dog Training VETiS program, the school (in partnership with Blue Dog Training) provides the equipment, materials and other resources necessary for the student to be able to undertake the training and assessment activities required to successfully complete their qualification.

Students and parents will need to check with the school to determine if there are any requirements for personal protective equipment (PPE) for activities in the school's manual arts workshop.



Training Costs, Funding and Eligibility

VETiS Funding

As identified earlier in this document the Queensland Government provides funding for eligible Queensland secondary school students to complete one (1) approved VETiS qualification while at school, referred to as 'employment stream' qualifications.

If a student is eligible, the course is provided to them 'fee-free', that is they do not pay any fees for this training. If there are any additional charges for the training, these are to be paid by the school.

To be eligible to enrol in a Blue Dog Training VETiS funded program, students must:

- Be currently enrolled in a Queensland Secondary School, in Years 10, 11 or 12
- Be an Australian Citizen, Australian Permanent Resident (including humanitarian entrant), temporary resident with the necessary visa and work permits on the pathway to permanent residency or a New Zealand Citizen
- Not already completing a funded VETiS course with another Registered Training Organisation (RTO)
- The Qualification the student is enrolling in must be eligible for funding under the VET investment budget

Fee-for-service Arrangements

Fee For Service arrangements apply:

- In situations where a school student is not eligible for funding. Under the DESBT funding arrangements, fee for service arrangements can be negotiated between Blue Dog Training, the Student/Parent and the school.
- Where the student is undertaking a qualification that does not attract a subsidy under the VET investment budget. Fee for service arrangements will be negotiated between Blue Dog Training and the School.

Note: Even though Blue Dog Training is not a CRICOS* registered training organisation, under the Department of Employment and Workplace Relations, *Guiding Principles for VET in schools delivered to overseas students*** VETiS qualifications can be offered to international students (on a fee for service basis) so long as the following conditions are met:

- The qualification makes up a part of the student's relevant school course; and
- The qualification is included in the scope of the school provider CRICOS registration for the school course.

*The Commonwealth Register of Institutions and Courses for Overseas Students (CRICOS) is an Australian Government register that lists all Australian education providers offering courses to people studying in Australia on student visas and the courses offered.

How Do I Enrol and When Can I Start?

A student can only participate in a Blue Dog Training VETiS program with the permission of their school. Before a student enrolls, they must read the Blue Dog Training Student Handbook and agree to abide by the policies and procedures set by Blue Dog Training.

The Student Handbook (available on Blue Dog Training website) provides information about services, policies and procedures.

Unique Student Identifier (USI).

As part of the enrolment process the student will need to provide their Unique Student Identifier (USI).

Course Commencement

VETiS courses typically commence in Year 10 or 11 and are completed during school hours as a part of the student's regular school timetable. Courses are expected to be completed over a period of two (2) years.

**CPC10120 – Certificate I in Construction (VETiS Funded)****Appendix 1**

This qualification provides an introduction to the construction industry, its culture, occupations, job roles and workplace expectations. The units of competency cover essential work health and safety requirements, the industrial and work organisation structure, communication skills, work planning, and basic use of tools and materials.

Completion of this qualification is a useful step towards the following career pathways:

- Bricklayer
- Carpenter
- Painter
- Plasterer
- Plumber
- Tiler

To achieve this qualification, you must successfully complete 11 units of competency:

- Eight (8) core units of competency
- Three (3) elective units of competency

Mandatory Workplace Health and Safety (WHS) training - The unit CPCCWHS1001 Prepare to work safely in the construction industry is designed to meet WHS regulatory authority requirements for WHS induction and must be achieved before access to any building and construction work site.

Successful completion of this unit of competency as part of this Blue Dog Training VETiS program will result in the student being issued with a General Construction Induction Training (GCIT) card. Previously known as a 'White Card'.

**CPC20220 – Certificate II in Construction Pathways (Fee-for-service)****Appendix 2**

This qualification provides a pathway to the primary trades in the construction industry with the exception of plumbing. Trade outcomes are predominantly achieved through an Australian Apprenticeship and this qualification allows for inclusion of skills suited for entry to off-site occupations, such as joinery as well as carpentry, bricklaying and other occupations in general construction.

This qualification is designed to introduce learners to the recognised trade callings in the construction industry and provide meaningful credit in a construction industry Australian Apprenticeship.

The qualification has core unit of competency requirements that are required in most Certificate III qualifications. The elective options are structured to allow choice from areas of trade skills as an introduction to a range of occupations.

Completion of this qualification is a useful step towards the following career pathways:

- Bricklayer
- Carpenter
- Painter
- Plasterer
- Joiner
- Tiler

To achieve this qualification, you must successfully complete 10 units of competency:

- Five (5) core units of competency
- Five (5) elective units of competency

**MEM20422 – Certificate II in Engineering Pathways (VETiS Funded)****Appendix 3**

This qualification is intended to provide exposure to people aiming to enter employment in an engineering, or related working environment. Completion of this qualification is a useful step towards the following apprenticeship career pathways:

- Engineering - Fabrication Trade (Boilermaking/Welding)
- Engineering - Fabrication Trade (Sheetmetal working)
- Engineering - Mechanical Trade (Fitting and/or Turning)
- Engineering - Mechanical Trade (Machining)
- Engineering - Mechanical Trade (Diesel Fitting/Fixed & Mobile Plant Mechanic)

This qualification:

- Will equip graduates with knowledge and skills that will enhance their prospects of employment in an engineering or related working environment.
- Delivers broad-based underpinning skills and knowledge in a range of engineering and manufacturing tasks that will enhance the graduate's entry-level employment prospects for apprenticeships, traineeships or general employment in an engineering-related workplace.

To achieve this qualification, you must successfully complete 12 units of competency:

- Four (4) core units of competency
- Eight (8) elective units of competency
